









Are you or someone you know a victim of crime?

At Victim Support Sweden (Brottsofferjouren), we can give you support and information. We will listen, give you advice and tell you about the legal process and what rights you have.

Victim Support Sweden is a non-profit organisation that provides support to victims, witnesses and family members. The support we provide is free of charge. We will give you support regardless of which crime you have been affected by or whether you have reported it to the police. What you tell us will stay with us and will never be revealed to anyone else.

Victim Support Sweden is not a government agency or authority and our organisation is politically and religiously independent. Our hundreds of trained volunteers are always on hand to provide support to every victim, witness or family member that contacts us. Human rights constitute the foundation of our organisation.

Victim Support Sweden is made up of local victim support centres around the country, our head office and a national Helpline that is free to call. If you speak Swedish or English then you can call Victim Support Sweden's Helpline at any time to ask a question, obtain information or make contact with a person at your local victim support centre who will be able to give you additional help and support.
